Landscaping Lagniappe

Your yard is often the first impression people have of your home. Use these summer tips to keep it looking beautiful!

- Fertilize your lawn with products high in nitrogen which fuels growth and the deep green color.
- Water your lawn early in the morning a few times a week. Deep soaking ensures deeper root growth and


- make a lawn less susceptible to drought. Also, think about an irrigation system for your flower beds.

- perennial flowering this summer. Also roses, caladiums are great for this time of year. For shady spaces or container annuals try impatiens, begonias and fuchsia.
- Apply plenty of mulch.
 Make sure it does not touch your tree trucks or plant stems but apply it deep— up to six inches.

Requests for permission to make structural changes to your property are available on our website. A committee of fellow homeowners will review your request to insure all changes, such as paint color, additional fencing or out-buildings, remain consistent with the intent of the neighborhood covenants. The committee will review

all plans and contact the homeowner in a timely fashion. Remember, all ACC requests must be made *prior* to beginning construction.

In addition, if you feel there have been violations to our covenants, homeowners may submit a grievance form via the website at. All grievances will remain confidential.





May 2012 100 Spring View
